

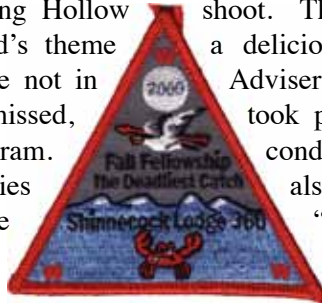

Lodge Rule Revisions

(To be voted on at the Winter Banquet)

- Combining the Lodge Positions of 1st Vice Chief, 2nd Vice Chief and 3rd Vice Chief into a single Lodge Vice Chief.
- Lodge Chief will be responsible for chapter operations.
- Lodge Vice Chief will be responsible for lodge events and committees.
- Addition of by-law: "No member may run for more than two Lodge or Chapter offices at a time." Separate letters stating the reason the candidate feels capable of fulfilling the responsibilities of the position must be submitted for each position.
- Addition of by-law: "Lodge Officer will take office at next official Lodge Executive Committee Meeting"
- Lodge Elections will be done at the Fall Fellowship instead of the Winter Banquet.
- Chapter elections will be held at each district's Fall Camporee.
- In addition to the rules revisions, the following will become standing lodge committees: Inductions (Elangomat & Ordeal), Special Events (Conclave & NOAC), OA/Troop Relations (OA Troop Representative & Unit Elections), Service/Scoutreach, and Communications (Website & Publications).

In addition, those under eighteen need to have letters from their parent(s) and Scoutmaster, giving them permission to run for and serve in the position.
