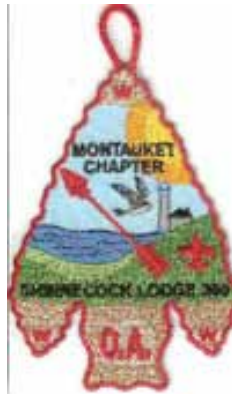

The 2009 Winter Banquet marks the start of Shinnecock Lodge's and America's new year. This year's banquet will be held at Baiting Hollow Scout Camp on Sunday, January 4th, 2009 beginning at 1:00 PM. All attendees will have an opportunity to learn about all the opportunities available to Arrowmen for participation in programs at the BSA's High Adventure Bases, both as a part of the Council's High Adventure contingents and as participants in the Order of the Arrow's own High Adventure trips.

In addition, the Winter Banquet is the time that we elect new officers for all Lodger and Chapter positions. In addition, all candidates for lodge office need to have attended a Lodge Leadership Development Day (LLD) or National Leadership Seminar (NLS).

All candidates for office need to submit a letter to their Adviser, indicating the position they want to run for, and describing why they believe that they would be a good candidate for the position. In addition, those under eighteen need to have letters from their parent(s) and Scoutmaster, giving them permission to run for and serve in the position.

NOAC 2009 Pre-registration

I am interested in attending the 2009 National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) at Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana from August 1<sup>st</sup> through the 6<sup>th</sup>, 2009. I understand that the total cost of attending the conference has not yet been established, and that any fees collected prior to January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2009 (or whenever the total cost has been established) will be refundable.

In order to give you an idea as to the likely cost to attend NOAC 2009: the conference fee will be \$395, air transportation will range between \$130 and \$300 (depending upon airline and airport), and ground transportation may range from \$50 to \$125. In addition, attendees typically spend between one and two hundred dollars each for personal expenses.

There will be a MANDATORY meeting of all prospective attendees and their parents (if under eighteen). The exact date of the meeting will be announced prior to January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2009.

Additional payment of \$295.00 (for a total of \$395) due by March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2009

Final payment of all fees by June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2009. **Note: An additional fee of one hundred and fifty dollars will be assessed, if final payment not received by June 26<sup>th</sup>.**
